SUMMER READING

Reading during the summer time enables children to retain and reinforce what they have learned in the course of the school year.

Here are some ways you can make reading fun for your child!

I'M INVOLVED!

- Show your child how useful reading is in everyday life (when making a grocery list, following a recipe, understanding the rules of a game, doing Internet searches, etc.).
 - Set up a reading corner and let your child decorate it. Give your child a variety of books to choose from like comic books, novels, magazines, flyers, catalogues, and newspapers.
 - Let your child choose the kind of book he wants to read.
 - Ask the oldest child in the family to read a book to the younger ones.
 - Visit a library when it's possible!
 - Be a role model and read!
- Ask your child questions to make her reading experience more interactive, for example: "What do you think will happen next?" "What would you have done instead?" "How would you like the story to end?" "Who was your favourite character?"
 - Do not force your child to read and do not make reading a chore. Avoid saying things like: "Go read a book instead!" "Go pick up a book!" "You should be reading!"
 - Subscribe to a magazine your child likes. She will look forward to receiving a new issue each month!
